### Instituto Franklin-UA Withdrawal Policy:

Withdrawal between December 20 - March 1: student will be charged a non-refundable fee of 500 euros
Withdrawal within first 7 days of the program: student will be charged 25% of the total cost of the program plus any additional costs incurred by Instituto Franklin-UAH on their behalf
Withdrawal after 7th day of the program: student will be charged 50% of the total of the cost of the program plus any additional costs incurred by Instituto Franklin-UAH on their behalf

Withdrawal or dismissal happens from the 25th day to the end of the program: student will be charged 100% of the cost of the program and no refunds will be given.
